20.103 Apologies and Approval of Absences

Apologies were received from Cllr Charles Tydeman and his absence was approved by the members

20.105 Approval of the minutes of the previous meeting the Parish Council Meeting on 15th September 2020

20.106 Contributions by Members of the Public –

There were no members of the public present however two members of the public had contacted the Chair asking him to raise the following issues

Car boot sales at Stonham Barns have been starting at 6am, this is specified on website, they are also using show ground in addition to the carparks. This falls outside of the planning conditions which state nothing before 7:30am and specifies two areas. The member of the public will be advised to write to the enforcement officer and the Clerk will seek clarification from the enforcement officer for the next meeting.

To achieve faster broadband for Stonham Aspal, a significant number of people and businesses need to apply for the cabling. Charles Brookson is trying to find the support for such a programme. Cllr Emberson and Cllr Betts said they would liaise with Mr Brookson and report back to the meeting. The Clerk will liaise with Suffolk County Council to find out if there is funding for this within money previously paid to BT

20.107 Funding for repairs for path through the church yard

Members agreed that they would like further clarification on whether they were legally allowed to fund the footpath before proceeding. They also wanted clarity on what footpaths were to be resurfaced on a map as they were unsure from the written description on the quotation

The members unanimously agreed that subject to confirmation on legal funding the members unanimously agreed the Parish Council could contribute a maximum of £2500 to the project.

The members also suggested obtaining additional quotations and applying for funding from District Cllr Suzie Morley's locality budget.

Consideration of Planning applications

20.108.1 DC/20/04296 Use of land for the stationing of 18 holiday, Stonham Barns Pettaugh Road Stonham Aspal Stowmarket Suffolk IP14 6AT

the Members unanimously agreed to object to this application as it is above and beyond the all-encompassing master plan agreed against application 3150/15 and would constitute an over development of the site.

This would overload local facilities. Traffic from these additional holiday units along with the proposed camping site would add to the traffic exiting from the site into a 60mph (50mph) stretch of road which is already a hazard. It would also add to the pressure on other busy and dangerous junctions along the A1120 such as the junction with the A140.

There is growing pressure on the utility infrastructure and it is questionable whether there is adequate capacity to install electricity, sewage, water, drainage, broadband to more units on the site without investment or overloading the existing facilities.

The area is reaching saturation healthcare is difficult to access and the school is nearly full.

It is imperative that any holiday units have an effective and enforceable means of ensuring that they are only used in the intended way i.e. not for residential purposes. Previous restrictions have appeared inadequate and difficult to enforce.

There is also an environmental impact from the growing number of units on the site. They are not been subject to the same requirements as housing developments and therefore there is no restriction on the fuel consumed which seems in conflict with the environmental ambitions of the county.
